1. Showroom Appointment: Explore Materials & Options

Meet with your designer to review countertop samples and learn the benefits of each material.

Your quote is based on:

- Material type
- Color group
- Square footage
- Sink selection

Helpful Tip: If you're replacing old countertops, bring rough measurements with you. It speeds up the quoting process.

2. Choose a New Sink

Most new countertops require a new sink. You'll review sink options suited for stone surfaces, including:

- Undermount Stainless Steel
- Farmhouse / Apron Front
- Undermount Composite or Porcelain

Important: Have your new sink on-site before the template appointment. Your fabricator may take it with them to ensure a perfect fit.

3. Hand-Select Your Slab (Granite & Quartz Only)

Stone and quartz slabs are unique. We'll schedule an appointment for you to choose your slab in person. You can:

Select from your quoted color group
Or upgrade to a different slab that catches your eye
Your slab will be tagged and held until fabrication begins.

4. Countertop Template

On the scheduled date, a technician will arrive to take exact laser measurements.

Please:

Clear off all counters

Have your new sink and faucet on-site
Be ready to confirm layout and cutout placement
The technician may take your sink with them. Installation
typically happens 1–2 weeks after templating.

5. Countertop Installation

Before install day:

Remove old countertops

Disconnect plumbing

Ensure cabinets are level (we'll handle this if we installed them)

Most installs take 3–4 hours. Please clear all walkways for safe access.

6. Reconnect Plumbing

Allow 24 hours for countertop adhesives to cure before reconnecting your plumbing.

You'll need to arrange a plumber to:

Hook up the sink

Install your faucet

Reconnect garbage disposal or dishwasher (if needed)

7. Enjoy the Transformation

Clean, durable, and made to last—your new countertops are ready to shine in your space.
